

Inaugurated Eschatology: Jesus experienced the future wrath of God, so that we can experience the future blessing of God today.

Since the great midpoint of history occurred at the time of Christ's first coming, there is a very real sense in which believers today are living in the new age. The final consummation of the kingdom of God, however, which will include the Second Coming of Christ, the general resurrection, and the renewal of creation, is still in the future. Hence the era in which we now live is characterized by tension – between the midpoint and the end, the present and the future, the already and the not yet.


