
# Surrendering All For Jesus in 2024

## Forbes Magazine on New Year's resolutions:

- 62% say they feel pressured to set a new year's resolution.
- More people cite improved fitness as a top resolution (48%) compared to improved finances (38%), improved mental health (36%), weight loss (34%) and improved diet (32%).
- Overall, 80% of respondents feel confident in their ability to reach their goals, and only 6% lack this confidence. (men are more confident)


#### **How Long Do Resolutions Last?**




### THE SELF-DIRECTED LIFE
