- Jesus is still dead: vs.13 But if there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised.
- Our faith is useless: vs.14 And if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain.
- We are still guilty in our sins: vs.17 And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins.
- Death wins, and we are hopeless: vs.18 Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished.
